I gave Wynn Handman a Lifetime Achievement Award at one of The Carnegie Mellon Showcase Of New Plays seasons, back when I was Artistic Director there. Edward Albee and Elaine Stewart were among the others so honored. Wynn, now 91 years old, is featured in today's New York Times -- still going strong in NYC as one of the top acting coaches in New York Theatre history.

Wynn was also the founder of the American Place Theatre -- early Obie Award winning Off Broadway home of early plays by Sam Shepherd, Marie Irene Fornes, Richard Nelson, others -- and first plays by "Literary" writers like Joyce Carol Oates, Robert Penn Warren, Robert Lowell, Sylvia Plath. My play, "Father Uxbridge Wants to Marry," with Olympia Dukakis, also premiered there.
